Rabbi's Reflections

This year we experience not only a secular leap year but a Jewish leap year! We are blessed with an extra day in February and an extra month of Adar, the month of joy! Because we have two months of Adar some argue that we should be doubly joyful or that we bring more joy into the world because we are obligated to be joyful for a longer period of time then a "normal" year. In any case, the month of Adar is intimately connected with joy.

There are two pieces of text which emphasis the joy in Adar: The month that was reversed for them from grief to joy. -Esther 9:22 When the month of Adar enters, we increase in joy. -Talmud, Taanit 29a

The very holiday we celebrate in Adar highlights how we turn from sadness to joy, the holiday of Purim. And because we have two months of Adar we actually celebrate two Purims: Purim in Adar II but the month before in Adar I we celebrate Purim Katan. We are provided with twice the opportunity to celebrate the survival of the Jewish people in Persia because of Queen Esther's bravery and honesty.

Abbi Naftali Silberberg highlights the beautiful connection between the human condition, sadness, joy, and connection with G-d, all through the lens of Purim:

"The history of our nation is very much compared to the human lifespan. Through the course of a lifetime every person undergoes drastic changes; fluctuation being the most consistent feature of life. The helpless newborn has virtually nothing in common with the independent, talented personality which will emerge years down the line. Adulthood, too, has ups and downs, happy days and depressing days, fulfilling days and seemingly wasted days. There is, however, one constant: the very identity and essence of the person. John Doe remains John Doe from the day he is born until the day he dies.

The same is true with our nation. We have ups and downs, both spiritually and materially, but our very identity, the fact that we are $G \square d$'s chosen nation, is never affected. It can actually be argued that, in a certain sense, our perpetual relationship with $G \square d$ is more evident when we are exiled and downtrodden due to our sins, and $G \square d$ still interferes on our behalf, as was demonstrated by the Purim miracle. This phenomenon demonstrates the durability of our relationship; the ability of our essential identity to survive no matter our external state.

All other holidays celebrate the "highs" of our nation. And therefore their joy is limited, because highs don't last. Purim celebrates a time when we were at a low point in our history – but our relationship with $G \Box d$ remained intact. Its joy is therefore greater than the joy of any other holiday, because it demonstrates the essential nature of our relationship with $G \Box d$ — and that is a constant."

When we have a special year, such as this year, and we have the extra month of Adar, are we to celebrate both Purims with the same intensity, the same level of joy? No, we are meant to slowly turn our joy up as we move through the two months of Adar. The Shulchan Aruch (a code of Jewish laws) states: "mark Purim Katan with a small, festive meal such as a special lunch, and generally (to) increase one's joy as well." This slow amplification of joy over two months allows us the ability to really check in and connect with our own personal joy. We can use this added time to not only bring joy to our community and family but to ourselves as well. Having more time to focus on joy means we can notice both, what brings about ours and others joy but also the aftereffects of that joy. And this is a beautiful gift, to see how we can bring more joy into the world, to see how joy affects our lives, the lives of others and our connection with G-d.

I wish you an even more joyous month of Adar II!

RITUAL COMMITTEE

Our search for a replacement for Rabbi Kami is going well.

We have contacted many organizations to find a new leader, including the Rabbinic Assembly, Reconstructing Judaism, the Academy for Jewish Religion (both east coast and west coast), the Central Conference of American Rabbis, and the Hebrew College.

The organization that has been most productive so far has been the Cantors Assembly. What, you ask? Why did we approach the Cantors Assembly? Well, the ritual committee felt that we should pursue every avenue and that we could be well served by a cantor who has a great singing voice, a friendly presence and a strong knowledge of Judaism. This was approved by our Board and the Ritual Committee.

For a few weeks, the search team has been interviewing all the candidates that have applied and has been forming first impressions. Some have been very good. Personally, my expectations have been exceeded. I thought that we would have a hard time attracting good candidates, but despite all our limitations (size, finances, age of congregation), Or Shalom presents very well. Also, it helps that we do have the pull of a great city like Philadelphia.

Of course, the search committee can only recommend a candidate. The actual choice will be made by the Board of Executives and then by a congregational vote.

The latest update is that we have invited one of the candidates to spend a Shabbat with us and he has agreed. Cantor Stephen Freedman will be spending the Shabbat of March 15 and 16 at Or Shalom. We will want this Shabbat to be very special. SO I INVITE/IMPLORE YOU TO ATTEND, IN PERSON, ONE OR BOTH OF THE SHABBAT SERVICES. We really need to show the best side of Or Shalom. We will have a nice kiddush after the service on Friday evening and will serve lunch after the service on Saturday morning. This will give you an opportunity to talk to Cantor Freedman and get to know him

Definition of Funds
