- [Day 224: Hamas Hostage Profile: Orión Hernández Radoux, 30](#)



The parents of Mexican citizen Orión Hernández Radoux remain in the dark about the status of their son, a traveler who was attending the Nova desert rave in Israel before being taken hostage in Hamas' Oct. 7 surprise attack. His girlfriend, 23-year-old tattoo artist Shani Louk, was abducted alongside him, tortured, killed, and then paraded as a trophy, semi-naked on the back of a pickup truck in Gaza.

Orión is a music producer who attends and DJs at festivals around the world. He has both Mexican and French citizenship and is the proud father of a small daughter.

Though they haven't heard anything official since late October, his father, Sergio Hernández, and mother, French-born Marie-Pascale Radoux, say they still have hope that their son is alive.

"Hope obviously exists," Hernández told CNN en Español this week. "We presume that he is alive because [his friends called] Orión's phone, and a terrorist or a person from Hamas said that Orión was alive, that they had him prisoner and that he was going to be used as exchange for political purposes."

Many of us have heard of Hersh Goldberg-Polin. He was born in Berkeley, California before moving to Richmond, Virginia. He and his family immigrated to Israel in 2008 when he was 7 years old. Hersh has two younger sisters. He was reportedly working with an initiative that was using soccer to bring Israeli and Palestinian children together. He reportedly planned a two-year world travel trip to start the last week of December 2023.

Goldberg-Polin was at the Supernova music festival when Hamas attacked on October 7<sup>th</sup>. He sent text messages to his family around 8:00 am saying "I love you" and "I'm sorry." During the attack, he took shelter in a field shelter. Hamas militants repeatedly threw grenades into the shelter. Hersh's arm was blown off from the elbow down during the attack. He fashioned a tourniquet for his injury before militants abducted him and put him on a pickup truck to the Gaza Strip.

His parents have worked tirelessly to bring him back, speaking at the UN, meeting with Pope Francis, Elon Musk, President Joe Biden, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken, 25 US senators, seven governors, and multiple celebrities and influencers. His mother wears a shirt with the number of days of his captivity taped to it.

On April 24<sup>th</sup>, Hamas released a video of Goldberg-Polin while in captivity. In it, he identifies himself, and says the Israeli government should be "ashamed" for "carrying their mission in Gaza" as the Israeli captives are stuck in an "underground hell with no food or water."
