AN IMPORTANT DECISION

At our annual meeting on June 8, a proposal to change the way in which we observe the three Festivals - *Pesach*, *Shavuot* and *Sukkot* - will be presented and voted upon by you, our valued members. I urge you to read my message below; it describes this proposed change and the reasons for it.

As a Conservative congregation affiliated with United Synagogue for Conservative Judaism, Or Shalom has a rich history of adherence to those tenets which serve to define us as Conservative Jews: *kashrut*, *Shabbat* and holiday observance, and the authority of *Halacha* (Jewish law) as defined and interpreted by our movement's most knowledgeable scholars.

Over two thousand years ago, a decision was made by the rabbis of that time to add an additional day to each of the three Festivals - *Pesach*, *Shavuot* and *Sukkot* - for communities far removed from Jerusalem. That additional day became known as *Yom Tov Sheni Shel Galuyot*, the second *Yom Tov* day of the Diaspora. Its intent was to ensure that those holidays be observed on their biblically mandated days.

Some three hundred or so years afterwards, the calendar was calculated and fixed mathematically so that the exact times when each holiday would begin were accurately determined. With that development, the need for a *Yom Tov Sheni* was no longer necessary; in fact, there was serious discussion of eliminating the extra day outside of Israel, but that change was not enacted.

The Committee on Law and Standards of the Rabbinical Assembly discussed this issue on three occasions: 1933, 1963 and 1969. It concluded that there was no halachic basis for continuing to observe *Yom Tov Sheni* and that the clergy of Conservative congregations should have the authority to discontinue its observance if warranted.

One of the statements in support of eliminating the second day revolves around the concept of *tircha d'tzibur* - a hardship on the congregation. Being that there are five holiday days currently added to the calendar (the second day of *Sukkot*, *Simchat Torah*, the second and last days of *Pesach* and the second day of *Shavuot*), observing them would mean losing a full week's pay (or vacation or sick time) for those in the workforce. It would mean missing a full week of school for students. In short, it would pose a hardship for them.

One of the statements in support of eliminating the second day revolves around the concept of tircha d'tzibur - a hardship on the congregation. Being that there are five holiday days currently added to the calendar (the second day of Sukkot, Simchat Torah, the second and last days of Pesach and the second day of Shavuot,) observing them would mean losing a full week's pay (or vacation or sick time) for those in the workforce. It would mean missing a full week of school for students. In short, it would pose a hardship for them.

Beyond that, there are those for whom the second day of the holiday is devoid of meaning; attending on those days would obviously not be a priority for them.

Here at Or Shalom, we are facing another, equally important consideration: the lack of attendance on those days. Most recently, on the second day of Pesach, we only had five people at services that morning.

And so, after a lengthy discussion by the Ritual Committee and an endorsement by the Board of Directors, a proposal to eliminate Yom Tov Sheni from our congregation's religious calendar will be brought to the congregation for a vote at the Annual Meeting scheduled for Sunday, June 8, 10:00 am.

If we enact this proposed change, we will be in alignment with the holiday calendar as it is observed in Eretz Yisrael, the land of Israel. It would be an expression of solidarity with our homeland that would go far beyond words.

There are implications to making this change which I will explain at an informational meeting on Zoom which is scheduled for **Monday, May 12, 7:30 pm** on Zoom. Here is the link:

Or Shalom Has Voted With Its Feet

At the beginning of the Jewish calendar, back in September, we began what we hoped would become a very popular event: A musical Friday night service. Cantor would lead the service accompanied by his guitar! We thought this would attract a good turn-out. We cancelled all other in-person Friday night services, so that the full focus could be on the musical Shabbat. We were wrong.

True, the first few services were well attended, but since then, attendance at in-person Friday night services has been extremely poor. We thought that the poor attendance was weather related, so we cancelled the in-person service in March, but held it in April. However, even with the improved weather, the service in April was poorly attended. Only 5 people showed up and that included the Cantor and Randi.

So the Ritual Committee has decided that we will only have in-person Friday night services twice a year. We would still continue the musical Shabbatot, but those would be via Zoom only. Instead, we would have an in-person Friday night service twice a year, once in the spring and once in the fall, accompanied by a Shabbat dinner. Both these Shabbatot would be during daylight savings time and, hopefully, will be well attended.

I'll stop there. Let's see how the response to this will be.

Note that in June and October we will hold the Shabbat dinners.

Remember: It's really up to you. This synagogue can only be as active and vibrant as you make it. Don't expect others to step-up. You need to do so yourself.

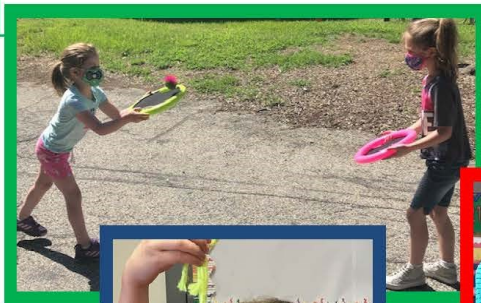
