The President's Column

Shana Tovah Everyone. For those of you who were unable to attend Kol Nidre services, this is the speech I delivered.

"It is good to see so many smiling faces tonight. Thank you for taking time to attend this service and listen to my hour long (just kidding-SMILE) speech asking for generous donations. Yes, the goal of my speech is to raise money and yes, I will get to that after I explain why I will ask each of you to dig deep. For those who already made a High Holiday donation, thank you. After you hear what I have to say tonight, you may be inspired to give more - feel free. For those waiting until tonight to make your high holiday donation, thank you in advance.

The reason I want to raise money for Or Shalom is: I WANT YOU TO BE HAPPY. So I asked myself, what does Happy mean? When in need of a definition, I refer to Webster's dictionary and this is what I read: "happy is most commonly defined as a feeling or state characterized by pleasure, joy, contentment or satisfaction with one's life or circumstances". Did you know there is a 2025 report known as the World Happiness Report. This report defines happiness as a person's subjective evaluation of their own life. How satisfied they feel overall and where they rate themselves on a scale from worst to the best possible life for themselves.

Did you know the World Happiness Report ranks the US as 24th in happiness. Just about 10 years ago we were ranked 11th, so we really have dropped. You may be wondering - what are the happy countries? Where does Israel rank in happiness? Israel is ranked 8th in the world just below the Nordic countries. Why are the people living in these countries happier than us? And, why did the Happiness quotient drop in the USA?

The main drivers for this decline in happiness in the USA are the loss of a sense of community and increased feelings of loneliness. Over the last few years, has your circle of friends grown or shrunk? Are you feeling more or less connected to people or on your electronics? A study from 1998 shows that a high usage of technology could create feelings of isolationism and possibly leading to depression.

I'll ask again - what is happiness? Happiness is internal - how one feels day to day. Mahatma Ghandi said happiness is.... When WHAT you think, say and do are in harmony. So, how do we get happy? Some scientists say happiness occurs when we have a purpose, have satisfaction and feel enjoyment.

Take the word Purpose - when we have a purpose, we have a goal, something to aspire to. When the goal is met, we feel satisfied. When we feel satisfied, we have enjoyment. These three things - purpose, satisfaction and enjoyment are a nice way to live in creating one's happiness.

In addition to having a purpose, feeling satisfied and enjoying life, scientists say there are 4 fundamental building blocks for happiness - family, work, faith and friendship. Israelis have a deep connection to family, their faith, their work and friendships which is why they are rated in the top 10 Happy Countries.

These 4 fundamental pillars are important and I'll review each one: Let's take family ... Some relatives in my family are happy when they walk into my house and just as happy when they walk out of my house. Each of you have your own individual families so enjoy and be happy with them. The 3 other building blocks of work, faith and friendship can be found right here at Or Shalom. When I say work for Or shalom, I mean volunteer. Step out of your comfort zone and help. Become a greeter at Shabbos services and enjoy the smiles you get. Become a member of the ritual committee and enjoy the camaraderie of working with other like-minded people to enhance your spiritual growth. Help us by creating a building committee to maintain our aging structure. Help is needed to create a Finance Committee. As we need to author an annual budget. Or really step out of your comfort zone and join the Board. Any one of these things will make Or Shalom better and for me the payoff has been priceless. I have developed terrific friends here who are there for me. What could be more valuable than enhancing your purpose, your Friendships, your faith. Friendships are solid here, when you call, we come, when we call, we need you to come. None of this happens overnight. In this world that can feel disconnected, Or Shalom offers a place where happiness can be achieved. The opportunity to feel connected is right here for you.

Now for the ASK:

I want to explain what you may have already seen in your prayer books and in your aisles. This year we have created a High Holiday pledge card- hold it up. Along with the blank pledge card is a blank envelope and a sheet of labels. We ask you to take the label sheet, find your family name and affix your name to the High Holiday pledge card. Do not put the label onto the envelope. Fold down your High Holiday donation amount, insert the pledge card into the blank envelope, seal the envelope and leave it on the seat. We will collect the envelopes after the service. Please pass the label sheet to the row behind you.

Thank you for paying your dues. Dues pays only a portion of our operating budget. Recently, we determined that dues pays about 40% of our expenses. Despite being very careful when it comes to spending money, we have had major unexpected expenses. Do you know, we had to replace non-functioning Air Conditioners - two of them and service several more units. Do you know, the township forced us to clean up the area in the very back, behind the dumpster, including felling trees and creating a wide path free of debris. Do you know the Commonwealth of PA insisted we service the elevator. These were very expensive tasks which took professionals several days to accomplish..

Due to the highly successful 2024 fundraiser celebrating the 50th year of Or Shalom, - thank you Beth Z and Mindy M - we had the cash to pay for these expenses. This fund is almost depleted.

Our next best revenue source is the rental income from The Cambridge School. Thanks go to Alan Daroff for his hard work in securing this lease with the school. I want to thank Warren Hyams who worked diligently for many weeks to save money on insurance costs. Brenda Belkin worked closely with him to provide data to the new insurance company and premium savings are now over \$6,500 annually. We depend on your donations to keep the building running smoothly. The township inspects the kitchen and that inspection costs money, PECO keeps our heat and lights on and sends us a bill each month, we offer programs you enjoy- just refer to the brochure passed out last week for a list of Cantor's lunch and learns. Your donations allow us to thrive.

Beginning on Rosh Hoshana and through the entire High Holiday season, we are praying for a healthy, sweet, peaceful Year here and certainly in Israel. We are praying to be inscribed in the Book of Life. Those of us awarded with another trip around the sun, that's good. I would argue that a full life is not only healthy, sweet & peaceful, it is also a life of purpose, satisfaction, enjoyment, family, work, faith and friends. With your financial help, regardless of amount, we at Or Shalom can continue to provide the building blocks of happiness.

Anyone willing to step out of your comfort zone and seize the day, please do so. I'll end with a quote from Anne Frank "Whoever is happy will make others happy too."

Shana Tovah and I hope all of you are sealed in the Book of Life and Happiness.

Better Late... And a Preview

This month's Horizons is a bit late but I'm really glad that it is, because I can write about the High Holidays and my message will be timely.

As you know, this was my second High Holiday season at Or Shalom; I'd like to reflect on my feelings about it.

I'll start off by saying that I felt uplifted at every service, but most especially at those with the largest attendance.

Honestly, there's an electricity, a sense of community when the sanctuary is filled. Looking out and seeing all of you made me feel good and makes me hopeful for the continued vitality of our congregation. I hope you felt that energy as well.

I know that many of you are the stereotypical "three-day-a-year" Jews; every synagogue has its share of them. You come to *shul* on the High Holidays and that's it.

I'd like to change that; if I'm successful, I'd be one of a very few Jewish clergy to succeed!

I wrote last month about ways you could increase your involvement at Or Shalom. I'd like to reframe some of what I suggested then in the following ways; in addition to the High Holidays, you could:

Become a "four-day-a-year" Jew: Attend one additional service this year. Just one!

Become a "six-day-a-year" Jew: Attend *Yizkor* services on *Shemini Atzeret*, *Pesach*, and *Shavuot*. You'll honor your departed loved ones and I'll bet it will make you feel good to do so.

Become a "fifteen-day-a-year" Jew: Attend one *Shabbat* service (Friday night or *Shabbat* morning) each month. The first Friday of each month is a guitar-accompanied "Musical *Kabbalat Shabbat*" with *ruach* and spirited singing. On a typical *Shabbat* morning you'll enjoy the *davvening* of our talented lay people, learn a bit of *Torah* and - if you attend in person - enjoy the camaraderie of *Kiddush* after services. And once a month, I teach a Lunch and Learn after services. A free lunch? Such a deal!!!

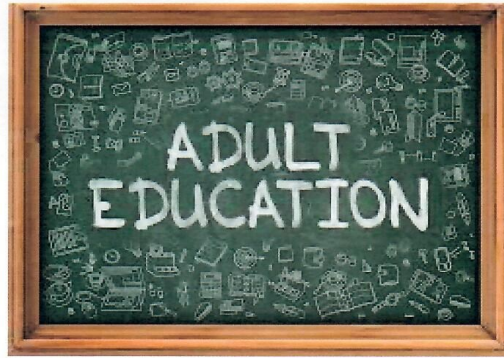

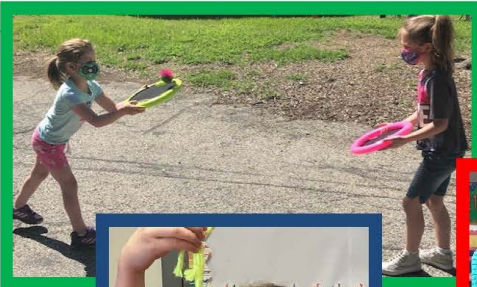
