The President's Column

Dear Friends - I hope you are well and enjoying the warm days of summer. As we enter the "dog days" of August, your Board is busy organizing for the High Holidays.

My heartfelt thanks to David Keet who, along with Scott and Andy are organizing the Ushers. Thanks to Brenda who is the greeter for services Erev Rosh Hashanah, Friday, September 11 from 7:45pm to 9:00pm. On Saturday, September 12, Day 1 Rosh Hashanah we are looking for Ushers from 10am to noon. The balance of the afternoon will be managed by Dan Markind - thank you Dan. Day 2 Rosh Hashanah is Sunday September 13 and services are from 9am to 1:00pm. We need Ushers from 10am to noon while Warren Hyams will cover the afternoon as the greeter. Thank you Warren.

Yom Kippur Eve falls on Sunday September 20th with services from 6:30pm to 8:00pm. We are searching for Ushers and a greeter for this night. Yom Kippur morning is Monday, September 21 with services from 9am to 1:00pm. Our Cantor's wife Randi Freedman is the greeter starting at noon and we need Ushers that morning from 10am to noon. Thank you Randi. Yom Kippur afternoon Monday, September 21 we need Ushers from 5:00pm to 8pm.

So you can see, your Board is busy despite the dog days of summer.

I want to thank those of you who have paid your dues in July. As you are aware, we have had to pay over \$45,000 in HVAC equipment and maintenance. Recently, a leak was discovered in the infant room of the Cambridge School. By the time we diagnosed & replaced the broken pump that caused the leak, mold had grown in two classrooms. Last week, the mold was removed, the rooms remediated and the cost was \$2,245. We now have to spend money to replace the dry wall and the insulation.

We continue to need help. Who will help to buy snacks for Tashlich? Who will help buy and organize the dessert buffet following services on Rosh Hashanah eve. Who will buy the food for "Pizza in the Hut".

If you are willing to be an Usher, please let Scott Markovitz or Andy Levin know so they can add you to the schedule. If you are willing to help with the food for Tashlich, Rosh Hashah and Sukkot, reach out to me. My phone is 610-247-0134.

The British Are Coming...No, the Holidays Are Coming!

As I write this, it's the middle of summer, and about the last thing anyone is thinking about right now are the High Holidays.

People always ask, "Are the holidays early or late this year?" Because the Jewish calendar is based on the lunar cycle, the dates vary from year to year. In a leap year, we add a full month, not just a day, so the holiday calendar can vary by several weeks from year to year.

My tongue-in-cheek answer to that question is, "Neither - *Rosh Hashanah* is right on time - the first day of *Tishri*!"

From a logistical standpoint, however, the holidays are somewhat early this year; *Selichot* is on Saturday evening, September 5 (Labor Day weekend) and *Rosh Hashanah* begins on Friday evening, September 11. You'll find the complete schedule of holiday times elsewhere in this issue.

I want to be clear about this: **Or Shalom is continuing to function as a full-service synagogue: we will continue to hold *Shabbat* services - albeit in a modified format; we will continue to offer Adult Education classes; we will continue to have periodic Lunch and Learn sessions after *Shabbat* morning services; we will continue to enjoy monthly Musical *Kabbalat Shabbat* services; we will continue to hold periodic social and educational events.**

In short, we will continue serving your spiritual, educational, social and communal needs.

As I wrote in my last Horizons article, "I am confident that Or Shalom will continue to be a vital religious community to all of its members and I look forward to continuing on that path with you in the year ahead."

Definition of Funds

10. Siddur Lev Shalem Visit our web site to learn how to donate. \$55 each.

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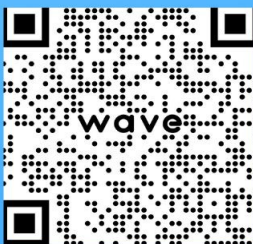
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CAMBRIDGE SCHOOL AGE PROGRAMS

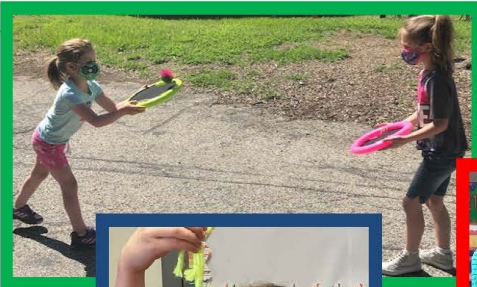
